

Coverage for Dependents up to age 26 - Disenrollment

Section 2714 of the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act, requires health insurance plans that provide dependent coverage to extend that coverage to adult children until age 26 for Plan Years beginning on or after September 23, 2010.

This provision affects Blue Cross Blue Shield of Wyoming individual and group health plans. This law will allow dependents to remain on their parent's policy until age 26 regardless of their student status.

Blue Cross Blue Shield of Wyoming has adopted a proactive approach and will allow currently covered dependents up to the age of 26 to remain on their parent's policy.

For Employers whose current plan is subject to the Wyoming Small Group Reform Statute, Blue Cross Blue Shield of Wyoming will no longer disenroll dependents up to age 26 beginning May 1, 2010.

Blue Cross Blue Shield of Wyoming is pleased to play an active role in Healthcare Reform by implementing this provision proactively along with other Blue plans.
